

MINUTES OF THE BUCKSKIN FIRE DEPARTMENT DISTRICT FIRE BOARD 08/14/2019-Open Meeting: Minutes to be approved at open public meeting on Wednesday, September 11, 2019. An Open Meeting of the Buckskin Fire Board convened on August 14, 2019 at 6:00 pm in the 2nd floor meeting room at Parker Fire Station, located at 1101 West Arizona Ave., Parker, AZ 85344 that convened at 6:00 pm, immediately followed by a **Work Session** to discuss Consolidation of Parker Fire District and Buckskin Fire District. 3. Call to the Public. Consideration and discussion of comments from the public. However, individual Board members may be permitted to respond to criticism directed to them. Otherwise, the Board may direct that staff review the matter or ask that the matter be placed on a future agenda. Public input is limited to two (2) minutes per session unless a greater amount of time is approved by the Board. The Fire District Board cannot discuss or take legal action on any issue raised during the Call to the Public that is not on the current Agenda; due to restrictions of the Open Meeting Law.

Work Session

Work Session regarding Parker Fire District and Buckskin Fire District to Consolidate. Starting immediately after the Buckskin Fire Board Meeting that starts at 6:00pm. *Note:* There will be no decisions made at this work session, for discussion purposes only.

Work Session began at 6:40 pm. Chief Maloney opened the meeting to let both Fire Boards know that Buckskin Fire District had been approached by Parker Fire Board in regards to the possibility of Parker Fire District consolidating with Buckskin Fire District, as the Parker Fire Board felt they needed some assistance in the management of Parker Fire District. Chief Maloney then introduced attorney William Whittington to explain what consolidations meant and how it worked, also introduced was representatives from James Vincent Group, who is an outside company that has worked with Bill Whittington with consolidations, writing the reports, such as a feasibility study, and impact studies for Fire Districts that have gone through this process before. Discussions continued with questions to the Chief and Board members from both Fire Boards regarding how the financial situations from both Districts would work and what the impact on both communities would be. Firefighters from the Parker Fire District expressed their opinions, letting know current Chief Ralph Beard that they meant no disrespect, but they would like better leadership and growth and they felt that a consolidation with Buckskin could award that responsibility. Chief Ralph Beard expressed that in the beginning, he wasn't sure what a consolidation would mean to Parker Fire, but as he understands the situation better, he expressed his agreeing that the consolidation could be better for Parker Fire District if everything worked out to the benefit of both Fire Districts. Both boards had a concern regarding feasibility and impact on the two districts, and that they would like to see more information regarding both of those factors being addressed. Chief Maloney stated that in order to start more work, the Parker Fire Board would have to write a letter to the Buckskin Fire District to request a possible consolidation and that does not mean that one or both Districts cannot stop the process at any time, just that it shows how serious Parker Fire District is concerning consolidation with Buckskin Fire District. Chief Maloney also stated that this is just in the fact-finding stage. If both Districts decide to move forward there would be costs associated with outside representatives to conduct the studies needed to make sure that **both** Fire Districts **benefit** from the consolidation going forward and if not, there would be no consolidation. Discussions will continue regarding this workshop, as no decisions were made at the meeting.

Chief's Monthly Report - July 2019

Troy Maloney, Fire Chief

<u>Personnel:</u> All are doing well. We have one employee out on Industrial Leave.

<u>Apparatus:</u> Boat-1 is out of service. The apparatus committee is recommending taking the cash-out from the insurance claim and investing it into the new boat.

New boat (Boat-11) quotes are far exceeding the \$225,000 budget we clearly stated to all the manufactures. Due to this, the apparatus committee is recommending taking the cash-out from the insurance claim and investing it into the new boat and continuing to operate only one fire-rescue boat.

Facilities: We are continuing to make station repairs as finances allow.

Incidents: July 1st, at 20:18, Boat-1, E-1102 and C-1100 responded to a boat fire across from the Buckskin State Park. E-102 arrived in the State Park to confirm a fully involved boat fire near the cliffs across the river. C-1100 continued over to the California side to try to make contact with the occupants/owner. Boat-1 arrived as the fully involved boat sank in a deep section of the river. BFD units were advised by La Paz County Sheriff's Dispatch that there was a burn victim from the boat fire located at the Big Bend Resort. C-1100 arrived on scene to find two victims; one with minor burns who refused any treatment and one with light second degree burns to their back. This patient was treated by medics from Boat-1 and transported to La Paz Regional Hospital by AMR. Cause of the fire was undetermined, but not suspicious.

July 4th, at 21:00 E-1101 and C-1100 provided a fire stand-by to the Roadrunner during their fireworks show.

July 4th, at 22:02, E-1101, E-1102, T-1131 and C-1100 responded to a brush fire off of Riverside Drive between Sundance Saloon and Buckskin State Park. Units arrived to find approximately a ¼ acre burning with active fire conditions. C-1100 took command and units extinguished the fire. The cause was undetermined and no injuries were reported.

July 4th, at 22:23, Boat-1 was dispatched to boating accident at the sand bar across from Fox's Resort. E-1101 responded from the scene of the brush fire to meet up with the La Paz County Sheriff's boat at Rio Lindo Shores' dock where the crew from E-1101 jumped aboard with their medical gear. Crews arrived to find a person still in the water with a severe neck injury from diving off of a boat into the shallow water. AMR met the crew from E-1101 at the Echo Lodge dock where patient care was passed to AMR. E-1101 called for a medical helicopter to meet the ambulance at the landing pad at La Paz Regional Hospital (LPRH) for flight to a Phoenix trauma center. A paramedic from E-1101 road to the hospital with AMR assisting with patient care. C-1100 pick the BFD medic from LPRH.

July 5th, at 21:00 Boat-1, E-1102 and C-1100 provided a fire stand-by to the Roadrunner during their fireworks show.

July 6th at 09:50 hours, Boat-1, E-1101, E-1102 and C-1100 responded to a vehicle that ran off of a cliff and rolled over into the water off of Riverside Drive south of Fox's Resort. Units arrived to find a vehicle in the water on the driver's side with one patient with minor injuries. The patient was treated by Buckskin units and transported to LPRH by AMR. A heavy rotator tow truck had to be brought in to recover the vehicle.

July 6th at 23:18 hours, Boat-1 provided fire stand-by at the Blue Water Resort fireworks show. Boat-1 had to extinguish a ¼ acre fire burning in the reeds.

July 7th at 14:49 hours, Boat-1 responded to a possible drowning near Sandy Beach just downriver of Station 11. Boat-1 arrived and conducted a search to find a near-drowning victim in the reeds near the shoreline. Boat-1 medics to patient care and AMR transported to LPRH.

July 10th at 07:38 hours, E-1102 and Tender-1131 responded to a brush fire at MM 165. E-1102 arrived to find approximately an 1/8 of an acre burning; Buckskin units extinguished the fire.

On July 14 at 09:06 hours, E-1101, C-1100 and Parker Fire responded mutual to CRIT Fire in the Town of Parker for a drowning call. E-1102 moved up for District

coverage. Units arrived to find two confirmed young children who were witnessed going under the water in a CRIT canal at California Ave and did not resurface. Three Buckskin Fire rescue divers, along with a rescue diver from the La Paz County Sheriffs performed a search pattern dive to find two bodies under the water approximately 300 yards downriver of the California Ave tunnel. Due to the amount of time the victims were submerged, both victims were pronounced deceased upon recovery. Despite the loss, efforts between the agencies went well.

July 16 at 17:05 hours, E-1101 and C-1100 responded with Parker Fire and CRIT Fire to a structure fire in a commercial building (Eagles Club) in the Town of Parker. E-1102 moved up for District coverage. Units arrived to find heavy fire conditions in the back side of the building. C-1100 took command of the incident with fire units making an offensive interior attack from the front and rear of the building. Parker PD confirmed that all occupants had been evacuated from the building. The fire had extended up into the attack roof area and there was an exposure to the building next door. Extensive work was completed to stop the progression of fire. The cause of the fire is under investigation with probable cause being due to a possible cooking fire that ignited three propane bottles at the rear of the building. The fire was extinguished and no injuries were reported.

July 17 at 18:27 hours, Boat-1and E-1102 responded to a boating accident in front of Rio Linda Shores. Boat-1 arrived to find an injured person from a jet ski accident still in the water. The patient was taken to the Rio Linda boat docks were E-1102 administer patient care. The patient refusing care and was turned over to LCSO. Boat-1 secured the jet ski at the Rio Linda boat ramp.

<u>Administration:</u> July 3rd, I attended a Parker Fire District Fire Board meeting workshop to educate the Board and Firefighters on the legal options a fire district has under ARS Title 48 as it pertains to Consolidation, Merger, Joint Powers Authorities (JPA) and Joint Management Agreements (JMA).

The presentation to the Parker Fire Board and their firefighters went very well. The Parker Fire Board is requesting to have a joint work session with the Buckskin Fire Board in early August to openly discuss the Parker Fire District consolidating into the Buckskin Fire District.

Barbara Cole, Lieutenant Foerstner and myself will be attending the AFCA/AFDA conference in Glendale next week. We will be available by phone if needed. Captain Byrd covered for major incident responses.

Don Rountree, Barbara Cole, Lieutenant Eric Foerstner and myself attended the AFCA/AFDA conference in Glendale. It was an excellent conference and had record attendance.

We received the Inter-Governmental Agreement (IGA) from the Arizona State Parks for the purchase of a new boat. I have sent the IGA over to Mr. Whittington for his review.

We are working diligently on the financial and operational analysis of the possible consolidation of the Parker Fire District into the Buckskin Fire District. Budgetary numbers are looking positive for both districts. I am going to be recommending that we contract the James Vincent Group (JVG) to assist us in providing financial oversite and budget development support during the initial stages of consolidation (if both Boards vote to do so) and the creation of the Impact Statement required by law. The JVG specializes in Arizona fire district consolidations, mergers and joint powers authorities. The cost will be split between the two districts.

The La Paz County Fire Chiefs Association Multi-Agency Master Mutual Aid Intergovernmental Agreement is being revised to accommodate our concerns. There will be an "out clause" and exportation date, as well as the deletion of San Bernardino and Riverside Counties. It also addresses the ability for Districts to recover cost through the billing of owner/occupant of which an incident has occurred.

July 31st, met with San Bernardino County Fire District Assistant Chief and Battalion Chief to discuss payment for BFD responses into California. This meeting went very well and we are expecting a draft contract for review by this October.


